Gilroy Community Support Meetings to be held Wednesday, July 31st An opportunity for emotional support and community connection.

Two concurrent public meetings will be held in Gilroy on Wednesday, July 31, 2019, 6:00PM – 7:30PM to provide emotional support and community connection for individuals and families impacted by the mass shooting at Sunday's Gilroy Garlic Festival. The meetings will be held simultaneously at **Community Solutions (9015 Murray Avenue #100) and at Rebekah Children's Services (290 IOOF Avenue, Main Building).** The meetings are open to all ages and will be held in **English and Spanish.**

These meetings are designed to give community members an organized and supported venue in which to be together and help each other through this difficult time. Counselors from Community Solutions, Rebekah Children's Services and the Centre for Living with Dying will facilitate small group discussions and will be available for individuals who need additional one-to-one support.

Support and counseling services are available throughout the week for families and individuals of all ages at Christopher High School.

The Gilroy Critical Incident Mental Health Response Team formed immediately following Sunday’s event and is coordinating emotional support and resources for the community. The team includes leaders from Santa Clara County Behavioral Health and local services providers, including community providers, Community Solutions, Rebekah Children’s Services, and the Centre for Living with Dying.
