The Academy will be demonstrating two law enforcement training simulators:

The Force Options Simulator is an immersive virtual-reality type device that allows officers to be placed in tense, rapidly evolving situations where they have to make split-second decisions and properly utilize reasonable force options (firearms, taser, OC, spray, baton, hands on). After the scenario, the officer is expected to explain what happened, and why they chose the option that they used.

The Law Enforcement Driving Simulators (LEDS) are used to help officers with their judgement and decision making while driving. The simulators are programed to respond exactly like actual patrol cars, and driving situations simulate real world scenarios. Officers work to improve their skills with collision avoidance, vehicle stops, pursuits, etc.
