

STD Facts - Did You Know . . .?



20 million new sexually transmitted infections occur in the United States each year . . .



... and young people make up ½ those cases.



Still, fewer than 12% of young people said they were tested for STDs in the past year!

STD Facts - Did You Know . . .?

MYTH: I DON'T HAVE MYTH: SYMPTOMS, YOU CAN SO I DON'T NEED TELL IF TO BE TESTED. SOMEONE HAS AN STD BY LOOKING. SEXUALLY ACTIVE YOUNG PEOPLE WILL GET AN STD BEFORE THE AGE OF 25. MOST WILL NOT KNOW IT. GET YOURSELF TALKING. MYTH: MYTH: IF I NEEDED I'VE ONLY TO BE TESTED, HAD ONE MY DOCTOR WOULD PARTNER SO I DON'T AUTOMATICALLY NEED TO GET TEST ME. 

HIV & STD Testing Services

What we test for:	What type of specimens are collected:			
Chlamydia & Gonorrhea	Self-Collected 3-Site Testing: Throat Rectal Vaginal OR Urine			
Hep C	Blood Test: Rapid Test: Fingerstick			
HIV	Blood Test: Preliminary Rapid Test: Fingerstick Confirmatory Test: Blood Draw (if needed)			
Syphilis	Blood Test: Blood Draw only



Results Ready In	3-4 days





PrEP (Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis) Services

- PrEP is a single daily pill that may prevent you from getting HIV
- PrEP is taken by a HIV(-) person BEFORE a potential exposure to HIV occurs

PEP (Post-Exposure Prophylaxis) Services

- PEP is for a HIV(-) person AFTER a potential exposure to HIV and is not on PrEP
- PEP must be taken within the first 72 hours after a potential exposure to work
- PEP is a medical emergency and can be accessed via:
 - Urgent Care
 - Emergency Room
 - The Crane Center






Partner Services

Needle Exchange (NEX) Program

- Exchange used needles for new needles
- Opioid overdose prevention kits & training
- Fentanyl test strips
- Substance use referrals
- Safer sex supplies & hygiene kits
- STD/HIV/Hep C Testing



Tips for Safer Sex During COVID-19





- You can get COVID-19 from a person who has it
- We still have a lot to learn about COVID-19 and sex




Have Sex with People Close to You

- You are your safest sex partner
- Communicate with partners virtually
- The next safest partner is someone you live with (i.e. roommates)
- Limit close contact, including sex, with anyone outside your household

Tips for Safer Sex During COVID-19 [Cont.]





- Kissing can easily pass the virus
- Rimming (mouth on anus) might spread the virus
- Wear a face covering or mask
- Get creative
- Masturbate together
- Condoms and dental dams can reduce contact with saliva, semen or feces



Skip sex if you or your partner are not feeling well.


Tips for Safer Sex During COVID-19 [Cont.]



Know Their Status

- Have they been diagnosed with COVID-19 using a nasal swab or saliva test?
- People who have recovered from COVID-19 at least 10 days from the day their symptoms started (or their positive test was taken) and who have not had fever for at least 24 hours are no longer likely able to spread the virus.
- If someone already had COVID-19, it does not mean they won't get it again.

Tips for Safer Drug Use During COVID-19





- Prepare your drugs yourself
- Do not share
- Dispose of works/equipment
- Contact NEX Program for supplies






If you are having sex or doing sex work, COVID-19 can be transmitted by close contact like coughing, kissing, or direct contact with bodily fluids. Ensure condom use.

Tips for Safer Drug Use During COVID-19 [Cont.]





- If you're alone start with a low dose and go slow
- If using with others, make a plan and stagger use
- Use fentanyl test strips
- Have naloxone on hand



Keep Clean & Practice Hygiene

Wash your hands with soap and water every time you are around other people, such as after using public transportation, after purchasing drug packages, etc.

Tips for Safer Drug Use During COVID-19 [Cont.]





- Access to prescription meds may be limited
- Try to stock up on your drug of choice
- Consider buying over the counter medications
- Buprenorphine or methadone






- Get checked out by a doctor
- Call NEX for delivery services
- Take your medications daily




