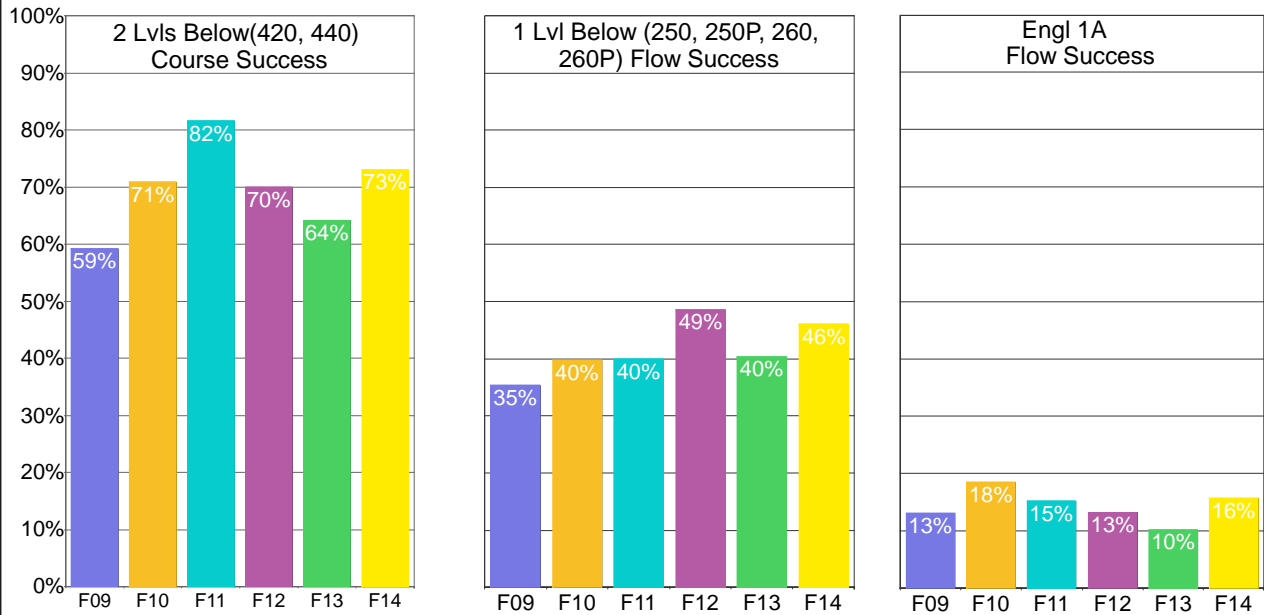

Note: All flow success rates are the number of individual students earning a grade of C or Pass or better at least once at each sequence level as a percentage of the initial cohort, that is, the number of students attempting and receiving a grade (including the W grade) in the initial first-level course during the cohort year.

Note: The Combined Cohort is not the linear sum of the indicated cohorts. Since an individual student may belong to more than one cohort, the Combined Cohort may count fewer students at various stages than the linear sum of the indicated cohorts.

Definitions:

- Cohorts are defined as students first taking and receiving a grade in the initial English course in the Fall term of the specified cohort year. Students who took English classes prior to the initial English class have been filtered out.
- Counts are unduplicated; students may have attempted and/or succeeded in a course more than once; multiple attempts and multiple successes at each level are counted only once.
- Cohorts are followed from their initial term through the Spring of the last of the indicated number of years (including summer terms between).
- The Combined Cohorts is the aggregation of all available annual cohorts. See the "by Cohort" report page for the statistics of each cohort.
- This English 2-Levels Below Sequence mimics the basic skills cohort tracking available on the state Chancellor's Office website. The levels are defined as: 2 Below is English 420 and 440; 1 Below is English 250, 250P, 260 and 260P; Transferable is English 1A.
