This course is an introductory nutrition course designed to introduce the general education and/or health interested student to the principles of nutrition which can be used professionally and/or personally. Nutrition will explore the science of nutrition, provide nutrient recommendations, explore the functions of digestion & metabolism, and discuss the impact that nutrition has on the human body; both anatomically and physiologically. This course will discuss macronutrients, water, vitamins, minerals, healthy body weight, performance nutrition, and specific nutritional needs throughout a person's lifetime. The student will analyze their personal diet record by utilization of a computerized nutrition program. AH 11 will address the impact of nutrition for chronic disease, food safety principles, and food poverty in the United States and our world. (C-ID NUTR 110). ADVISORY: Chemistry 30A.

This course introduces the concepts, methods of inquiry, and scientific explanations of biological evolution and their application to the human species. Issues and topics will include but are not limited to, genetics, evolutionary theory, human variation, and biocultural adaptations, comparative primate anatomy and behavior, and the fossil evidence for human evolution. The scientific method serves as the foundation of the course. (C-ID: ANTH 110)

ANTH 3: Introduction to Cultural Anthropology

Transferable: CSU, UC; CSU-GE:D, IGETC:4, GAV-GE:Area 4, D, F

The course explores how anthropologists study and compare human cultures. Cultural anthropologists seek to understand the broad arc of human experience focusing on a set of central issues: how people around the world make their living (subsistence patterns); how they organize themselves socially, politically and economically; how they communicate; how they relate to each other through family and kinship ties; what they believe about the world (belief systems); how they express themselves creatively (expressive culture); how they make distinction among themselves such as through applying gender, racial and ethnic labels; how they have shaped and been shaped by social inequalities such as colonialism; and how they navigate culture change and processes of globalization that affect us all. Key concepts of power, social justice, equity, ethnocentrism, cultural relativism, race, anti-racism, decolonization, ethnicity, gender, sexuality, class, kinship, ritual, belief systems, and symbolism will be covered. Ethnographic case studies highlight these similarities and differences, and introduce students to how anthropologists do their work, employ professional anthropological research ethics and apply their perspectives and skills to understand humans around the globe. Students will write a research paper based on original fieldwork in a local community. (C-ID ANTH 120).
