Performance Courses: In addition to completing the core courses, an emphasis in Art, Music or Theatre must be completed with a minimum of 6 units of activity courses in that area. Three units of electives from the other performance areas should be taken to complete the 9 unit minimum.

The General Fine Arts Degree provides the knowledge base and experiences for students interested in the study of art, theatre and music. Students completing this degree will be able to critically analyze and interpret various mediums of fine arts. Students will have the ability to recognize, value and nurture aesthetic forms of fine arts and build a foundation to foster further artistic thought and endeavors.

Students transferring to a four-year institution will be prepared for additional study in the fields of creative arts, elementary & secondary teaching, Fine Arts, Humanities, Interdisciplinary Studies and Liberal Studies.

Program Learning Outcomes: After completing this degree a student will be able to:

- ▶ critique and evaluate the performance and execution of artistic endeavors in art, theatre and music.
