By the end of this course, a student should:

1. Identify, examine, and assess representative works of art and architecture from prehistory to the medieval era employing appropriate art historical terminology.
2. Analyze works of art and architecture in terms of aesthetic, socio-political, religious, historical, technological, and cultural contexts in which they were created.
3. Develop critical thinking, information literacy, and problem solving through an engagement with art, architecture, artists, and patrons from prehistory to the medieval era.

Part 2:

By the end of this course, a student should:

1. This course introduces students to visual art and architecture from prehistory to the medieval era with a focus on art from Europe, North Africa, and the near East. The course will further consider global interactions involving these regions.
2. Obtain a level of proficiency in feminist pedagogy and cultural diversity outside of the standard European-American art views. Students will recognize the social, economic, cultural, historical, political platforms of cultures beyond the androcentric views of art history, and learn to make connections to their own diverse culture.
