COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course focuses on the nurse's role in the care, evaluation, and implementation of nursing interventions with diverse adult patients with mental health disorders. Risks for suicide, substance abuse, and other mental health disorders are covered. 6. Provide safe quality patient-centered nursing care for adults with mental health disorders.
7. Describe the principles and procedures associated with a mental health examination of adults.
