



California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC)

2025 - 2026

Completion of the requirements will permit a student to transfer from a community college to the California State University or the University of California without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division general education courses to satisfy campus general education requirements. All areas must be satisfied, and all courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better before they can be certified. A student is strongly advised to complete 60 transferable units before transferring. These will include Cal-GETC requirements, "major" prerequisites, and elective courses if needed. (Students must request a certification from the Office of Admissions and Records before transferring.)
