

Completion of all the requirements in the IGETC will permit a student to transfer from a community college to the California State University or the University of California without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division general education courses to satisfy campus general education requirements. All areas must be satisfied, and **all courses** must be completed with a **grade of "C" or better** before the IGETC can be certified. See requirements for partial IGETC certification in catalog. A student is strongly advised to complete a total of 60 transferable units before transferring. These will include the IGETC requirements, "major" prerequisites, and elective elective courses if needed. **(Students must request an IGETC certification from the Office of Admissions and Records before transferring.)**
