

# **Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP):**

Defined as the successful completion of coursework toward an eligible program. The Financial Aid Office is obligated by federal law to monitor a student's SAP status.

### How is this pace calculated?

This is done at the end of each term (*Fall, Spring, and Summer*) and applies to a student's entire academic history at Gavilan College, whether or not they have received financial aid.

  - \*Chafee recipients should reach out to the Financial Aid to determine eligiblity.

# **SAP Requirements:**

- ✓ GPA Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 for all attempts units at Gavilan College
- ✓ PACE: Must complete 67% of all classes you attempt at Gavilan College
  - Attempted Coursework includes classes with grades of F, No Pass (NP), Emergency Withdrawal (EW), Withdrawals (w), No Credit (NC) and report Delayed (RD).
  - Completed Coursework includes classes with grades of A,B,C,D, Credit (CR) and Pass (P).

Maximum Time Frame – Stay within 150% of the units required to complete educational goal.

✓ At Gavilan College, an Associate's Degree takes 60 units to complete. Therefore, the maximum number of units that a student may take in order to maintain their financial aid eligibility is 90 units (60 units multiplied by 150%). However, not all academic programs are 60 units in length, such as Certificates of Achievement and Specialist Technical Programs. The Maximum timeline is calculated specifically for each individual academic program:

Program	Total Units Required for Program	150% of Program
Certificate	30 Units (for most certificates)	45 units attempted
Associate or Transfer	60 units (for most AA/AS	90 units attempted
Degree	degrees)	

# **Regaining Your Financial Aid**

Students have two options to resolve their SAP in order to regain financial aid eligibility at Gavilan College: **Option 1:** Reinstatement

Student can regain financial aid eligibility by completing enough classes in good academic stating to increase their overall PACE and Cumulative GPA to the minimum requirement. This may take the student a few semesters. Reach out to our Office for more detail about how many units you would need to reinstate.

### **Option 2:** Submit an SAP Appeal through Student Forms

If you do not meet SAP requirements, you're given the opportunity to appeal the loss of financial aid by addressing why you were not able to meet requirement and explain your extenuating circumstances that prevented you from completing.

Examples to appeal include but not limited to:

# Accident/Injury/ Death • Student • Relative • H • M

# Other Medical Circumstances

- Illness (Not Chronic)
- Hospitalization
- Mental health

### Loss of

- Child care
- Job
- Income
- Housing/Shelter
- Access to personal or public transportation

### Other

- Pregnancy or birth of a child. Being a victim of a serious crime, including, but not limited to, domestic abuse, even if the crime was not reported or did not result in criminal prosecution or civil liability.
- Natural disaster.
- Change of major.

# Bachelor's & Master's degree

Student with a BA/BS and/or Master's degree is NOT ELIGIBLE for State and Federal
grants but may be eligible for student loans. If you are interested in a student loan, you
must be enrolled in an eligible program and complete the SAP Appeal process. Loan
funding will be restricted to the units on your Comprehensive Educational Plan.

# **SAP Appeal Process**

# Steps to an SAP Appeal:

# Step 1



- •Request SAP Appeal via Student Forms.
- •In your appeal, please indicate the reason why you did not meet SAP requirements and explain your extenuating circumstance.
- Explain if your extenuating circumstance(s) have been resolved or changed.
- •The steps you will take to ensure you continue to meet Satisfactory Academic Progress in the future.

### Step 2



- Meet with your Counselor to develop/update an Ed-plan.
- Please include your Ed-plan on your appeal.

## Step 3

- Provide supporting documentation of your extenuating circumstance(s).
- Please allow time to review. It takes 4-6 weeks to review upon submitting your appeal.

# SAP Statuses Explained

Satisfactory

- You are Eligible for Financial Aid
  - Your status is **SATISFACTORY** if you meet minimum standard requirements and have not reached or exceeded the Maximum Time Frame for your program.

**Warning** 

- You are Eligible for Financial Aid
  - Your status is WARNING if you did not meet one of both of the SAP requirements.

Disqualification

- MAXIMUM TIME FRAME
- YOU ARE NOT ELIGIBLE for FINANCIAL AID

If your appeal is approved your status is APPEAL APPROVED - WARNING

You must meet SAP REQUIREMENTS, or you will be DISQUALIFED the next term.

### **SAP Requirements:**

- ❖ GPA requirements: You must achieve a GPA of at least a 2.0 overall.
- ❖ Pace of Progress: You must successfully complete 67% of all units attempted.
- ❖ Until you are off APPEAL APPROVED WARNING.

Ineligible

- You are Not Eligible for Financial Aid (Does not apply for CCPG)
- Your status is **INELIGIBLE** because you are not mathematically able to meet SAP requirements by the end of your educational program.





\*Appeals may require additional documentation and a meeting with the Director of Financial Aid.
