Response and follow-up to previous program reviews

- Increase student participation in campus events and activities by 10% or 300
 - There has been some increase in student participation in campus events. We don't have a particular metric to assess that.

There are no dedicated funds to these programs. In order to achieve our goals, we will need designated funding.

There will be some collaboration with the Welcome Center & ASGC as those are areas that both SL Coordinators oversee. We hope to collaborate with other student services areas on the cultural events series as well as with faculty members on the social justice event series.

We meet with the PIO team to strategically plan events for the semester, with plans to establish a year-long calendar of events. The PIO team markets these events on and off campus. Additionally, we collaborate with CAPS and guided pathways during Welcome Week and campus registration events to help connect incoming students to their academic pathways. Included in these conversations are the Outreach and Career and Transfer Fair departments. We are in the process of developing coordinated events that ensure a clear and simplified pathway for students.

We have the opportunity to increase the student services programs offered to our student body & there is increasing student interest and participation. The threat we face is that there is no designated funding for any of these student services programs. Another threat is that we do not have student workers or additional staff to help organize and run these events.

No funding or student staffing allocated to these areas of general student engagement, cultural/social justice programming or civic/community engagement. In order to have consistent events year over year, we need to have funding and staffing to complete these programs effectively and to continue to grow them. It is important

to separate the work ASGC decides they want to do in a particular year from the ongoing programs student services would like to always provide.
