Know what to do

If a federal immigration official is on campus and requests access to student information, access to district records or entrance to a facility:

Do Not Panic

Immediate compliance is not required. Our college has state legal procedure we have to follow. Immigration officers are not above state laws.



3

Communicate

Politely inform the officer that you are not obstructing their process but must refer them to the proper channels for guidance and assistance.

Notify Campus Security Immediately:

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Can I release student information to law enforcement ?

No. Only with official district permission. Student data is protected by FERPA.

Will the Gavilan College Security enforce federal immigration laws? No. Gavilan College will not:

- Make agreements with law enforcement about immigration law.
- Honor immigration hold requests.
- Arrest or question people based on their immigration status

Gavilan College supports the California Trust Act (AB 4), which bars minor infractions from triggering deportation. Trustees will advocate for all students' rights.

Can law enforcement access all areas of the campus without permission?

No. Some areas, such as classrooms and locked offices, are for authorized personnel only. Access requires district permission.

Are there different rules for international students?

No. Campus policies also apply to international students.
