Enrollment Management Academy (EMA) Conference

A team of 10 Gavilan College administrators, faculty, and staff participated in the annual Enrollment Management Academy (EMA) at UC San Diego July 13th–17th, an intensive five-day institute focused on strengthening community college enrollment strategies through access, retention, and completion initiatives. Our team collaboratively created an immediate action plan tackling critical areas: Access & Enrollment, Student Support & Retention, and Success & Completion.

Summer Enrollment Comparison

Headcount Trends

- Summer 2023 served as the baseline year following the return to more in-person offerings post-pandemic. Enrollment was steady but modest.
- Summer 2024 showed a slight decline in headcount compared to 2023, reflecting statewide enrollment pressures.
- Summer 2025 rebounded with higher overall headcount, surpassing both 2023 and 2024, signaling increased student interest in accelerated and flexible summer options.




FTES (Full-Time Equivalent Students)


- o FTES in 2023 was stable but below pre-pandemic levels.
- o **2024** dipped slightly, consistent with the decrease in headcount.
- o **2025** demonstrated a notable increase in FTES compared to both 2024 and 2023, indicating stronger enrollment intensity (more units taken per student).

Scheduling & Access

Across all three years, Gavilan continued to offer a diverse mix of **4-, 5-, 6-, 7-, 8-, 9-, and 10-week sessions**. However, in 2025, and updated flexible model contributed to enrollment growth, as students could select more accelerated courses to fit their needs – taking more classes within the summer session compared to previous years. These enrollment trends reflect meaningful shifts in **student demand and course access**.


Overall, Summer 2025 enrollment and FTES outperformed both 2024 and 2023, marking a strong positive shift in summer participation. Expanded scheduling options, consistent access to online and in-person courses, and targeted outreach likely contributed to this growth.








Summer 2025 multi-session course layout

STEM

ITYC Summit

Dean Nari participated in the inaugural Innovation in Two-Year College STEM Education (ITYC) Summit, held in Alexandria, VA from **July 29**th-**31**st. The invitation-only event brought together NSF's IUSE awardees—faculty leaders from two-year colleges—for interactive sessions aimed at sharing evidence-based practices, building collaborations, and exploring strategies to elevate STEM education. Attendees engaged with fellow awardees, prospective principal investigators, and NSF program officers to discuss grant development, scalable solutions, and national STEM initiatives for two-year colleges

SHPE Conference

Two officers from the Society of Hispanic Professional Engineers participated in the 2025 SHPE NILA Certified Chapter Leaders Program Online Conference in late July.

MESA Week Zero event

July 28th- Aug 1st the MESA Week Zero event welcomed incoming students transitioning from high school to college. The event introduced students to campus resources, faculty, and peers through a variety of activities, including academic workshops in math, chemistry, computer science, biology, environmental science, and premed, as well as sessions on LinkedIn, financial aid, career readiness, and student life. Students also attended



presentations from academic support services, toured the Gilroy campus, and engaged in networking with alumni and campus clubs. The week concluded with a tour of the UC Santa Cruz main campus and UCSC Coastal Science Campus.







STEM/Math Orientation

A Math Orientation was held on **Monday, August 4**th, inviting students who are taking

precalculus & calculus this upcoming Fall Semester. It was an opportunity for attendees on to be introduced to the courses and the instructors. Four workshops were hosted: Preparing for college, how to use the tutoring centers effectively, studying tips, and time management. Campus resources on campus were presented and as well as setting up appointments with a STEM counselor.



Enrollment Update

As of early August, 88 new students have enrolled for the Fall 2025 semester.

New ESL Partnership

Gavilan College has partnered with Anzar High School to offer ESL 784: ESL Lifeskills 1A (Non-credit) on their campus in San Juan Bautista. Classes will be held Mondays and Wednesdays from 6:00 PM to 9:15 PM, starting August 25th, 2025.

Orientation Sessions

Four new student orientation sessions are scheduled throughout August to assist incoming students with their transition - two in Hollister and two in Gilroy.

Faculty Development

A professional development day for non-credit faculty is planned to promote instructional excellence and collaboration.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION

Elder Care Course

In collaboration with the Seniors Council of Santa Cruz and San Benito Counties, the Hollister Campus will host an 11-week Elder Care course this fall. This initiative aims to address the growing need for elder care education and support in our region.

EMT Training Program

An EMT (Emergency Medical Technician) course will be offered at the Hollister Campus through the English Language Learning Grant. The course, starting August 16th, 2025, will be free of charge for students who meet eligibility requirements, helping to remove financial barriers and promote career advancement in emergency medical services.
